Works notification: Major works continue at Cherry Street

We're removing the dangerous and congested level crossing at Cherry Street in Werribee by building a new road bridge, connecting Tarneit Road to Princes Highway.

We're making significant progress as construction continues at Cherry Street. Throughout September, we began to install the concrete support structures for the pedestrian underpass retaining walls. We also asphalted Jellicoe Court and Jellicoe Street, following the completion of the work to reroute the irrigation pipeline.

This letter provides an overview of the changes to the way you'll travel and construction activities that you may notice during October.

Upcoming works

Throughout October we'll continue working on the Cherry Street pedestrian underpass. We'll install concrete support structures for the pedestrian underpass retaining walls and we'll begin excavation for the ramps leading down to the underpass on both sides of the rail line.

In October we'll begin construction of the new, safer signalised intersections at Tarneit Road and Railway Avenue, and Princes Highway and Wattle Avenue. We'll also start working on Princes Highway where we will be adding an additional lane.

During this time, vegetation trimming, and removal will be completed on Princes Highway and construction will commence to install the road bridge reinforced earth walls.

To minimise impacts to the local community, the work we do to signalise the Wattle Avenue and Princes Highway intersection will be undertaken in three stages. The first stage of the works will begin in October and will involve drainage and conduiting works, pavement works, concreting, traffic signalling and asphaltting. During this time, there may be short term intermittent access changes to Wattle Avenue.

The second and third stages of the works will occur between late 2020 and early 2021 and will involve realignment of the median strip on Princes Highway and connecting the intersection to the new road bridge.

We'll continue works to relocate the footpath near the Tarneit Road and Railway Avenue intersection, as we make way for the new left turning lane.

We'll need to close the main entrance to our site via Cherry Street from late October to mid-2021 to make it easier and safer for larger vehicles entering and exiting the site. Large vehicles will now access our site via Princes Highway and light vehicles will use Jellicoe Court as an alternative access point.

Heavy machinery including excavators, cranes and piling rigs will be operating in these areas during the works. We'll take every measure to reduce construction impacts, however you may notice increased noise and vibration.

Changes to the way you travel

- **Intermittent lane closures and reduced speeds:** There'll be intermittent lane closures and reduced speeds on Cherry Street, Princes Highway, Wattle Avenue, Tarneit Road and Railway Avenue throughout October. We'll have signs in place to alert motorists to the changed conditions.

- **Pedestrian detours:** Pedestrians will continue to be detoured from the Bunnings side of Cherry Street to the Woolworths side until mid-2021. Pedestrians will also be detoured via Tarneit Road from Railway Avenue until mid-2021.
- **Bus stop closure on Princes Highway:** The bus stop on the southern side of Princes Highway adjacent to Wyndham City Council offices will be closed from late September until early 2021. During this time passengers can use the alternative bus stop, which is approximately 200m west on Princes Highway.

Reduced speeds, intermittent lane closures and pedestrian and vehicle detours will be in place and traffic management will be in place to guide you safely through the area.


